**Biographical Note**

Saul Rosenzweig was born February 7, 1907 in Boston, Massachusetts. Rosenzweig received his Artium Baccalaureus degree in Philosophy Summa Cum Laude in 1929. From 1932 until 1934 Rosenzweig was associated with the Harvard Psychological Clinic. He earned his PhD in Clinical Psychology in 1932 from Harvard University. From 1934 to 1943 Rosenzweig was a member of the staff of the Worcester State Hospital. In addition to his work at the hospital he lectured at Clark University from 1938 until 1943. In 1943 Rosenzweig joined the staff of the Western State Psychiatric Institute in Pittsburgh as Chief Psychologist and a lecturer on psychology at the University of Pittsburgh. In 1949 Rosenzweig left Pittsburgh for Washington University in St. Louis, Missouri to become chief psychologist at the Child Guidance Clinic, and associate professor of psychology in the graduate school, as well as medical psychology at the psychiatry department of the Washington University Medical School. He was an advisory editor for the Journal of Consulting Psychology from 1959-1964 as well as for the Journal of Abnormal Psychology. Rosenzweig founded and was the first president of the International Society for Research on Aggression and was also on the editorial board of that organization's journal Aggressive Behavior. He remained at Washington University becoming Professor Emeritus in 1975. In 1972 Rosenzweig founded and became the managing director of the Foundation for Idiodynamics and the Creative Process.

## Scope and Content

The Saul Rosenzweig Papers consists of five series:

1. Correspondence
2. Foundation for Idiodynamics, Personality Theory, and Creativity in Literature
3. Psychoarchaeology
4. Sexology
5. Reprints

The correspondence series dates from 1929 to 2002.

The original order of the collection has been maintained, including Rosenzweig's filing system where appropriate. In addition, Rosenzweig used subject headings to organize his papers. These subject headings have been maintained throughout this collection as a means of locating material.

Correspondence from 1929 to 1950 was kept in incoming and outgoing folders alphabetically by the correspondent's last name. Correspondents of special significance to Rosenzweig were given folders of their own and stored in a separate file alphabetically by last name. Post-1950 correspondence is kept in incoming and outgoing folders by year. Letters within these folders are arranged alphabetically by the last name of the sender or receiver. Correspondence that Rosenzweig kept with relevant subjects have been maintained with that material within the body of the collection.

The Foundation for Idiodynamics, Personality Theory, and Creativity in Literature was founded in 1972. This series most notably consists of Rosenzweig's autobiography, some Foundation records, and drafts of books on various aspects of idiodynamics, most notably *The Road to Idioverse*. This series is described at the folder level.

The Psychoarchaeology series is described at the box level. Each box has the subject headings in that box listed. Some of the material in the sub-series on Sigmund Freud is in German or Hungarian. There are microfilms of documents from Austria that have been separated out of the collection and are located in separate microfilm boxes. Microfilm box #1 and #2 are located in M3711.1. Microfilm box #3 and #4 are located in M3692. The Sexology series consists of papers, reprints and some correspondence and is described at the box level. There is one VHS videotape that has been separated into the Archives Media collection.

The Reprint series is organized chronologically; each reprint was numbered by Rosenzweig and was put in that order. Some of the prints are with the drafts of books in the Foundation for Idiodynamics series.

## **Description of Series**

### **Series 1: Correspondence (1929 – 2002)**

This series contains correspondence to and from Rosensweig and later the Foundation for Idiodynamics. It also includes correspondence relating to the Picture – Frustration Study.

### **Series 2: The Foundation for Idiodynamics, Personality Traits and Creativity in Literature.**

This series consists of Rosenzweig's autobiography that he prepared for an article commemorating his contribution of Common Factors to the field of psychoanalysis, as well as book and manuscript proposals. This series also includes the Foundation's mission statement, history, and organizational and some operational records.

### **Series 3: Idiodynamic Psycho-archeology**

This series is divided into sub-series of material about Sigmund Freud, William and Henry James, Herman Melville, and Nathaniel Hawthorne.

### **Series 4: Sexology**

This series consists of reprints of early sexology articles, material on Oedipus, bisexuality, and vasectomy.

### **Series 5: Reprints**

This series comprises reprints of articles by Saul Rosenzweig including his early work on Common Factors, Picture-Frustration Study and Idiodynamics.
