## “Excavating Hattusha, the Capital of the Hittite Empire: Results and Perspectives of Recent Research”

Dr. Andreas Schachner  
German Archaeological Institute, Istanbul



During the Late Bronze Age, the Hittites were one of the most influential empires in the ancient world. Their capital, Hattusha (modern Bogazkoy in central Turkey), has been excavated by archaeologists for over a century, but many parts of the city still remained unexplored. Dr. Schachner’s lecture will highlight recent German excavations in western Hattusha revealing new evidence for the function and dating of this previously unexplored part of the city.
