

2010 OMEA Professional Conference

Graduate Credit

through The University of Akron, School of Music

To receive one (1) graduate credit for attending the 2010 OMEA Professional Conference in Cincinnati:

pre-register by requesting a workshop application from The University of Akron, School of Music, Dr. William K. Guegold, Director, Akron, Ohio 44325-1002 (330-972-7590)

OR

visit the graduate credit registration booth at the OMEA Conference.

Complete both sides of the application and return it by mail to the address above, **OR** submit the application at the conference registration area. The application must be accompanied with a check for the appropriate tuition and fees. Checks should be made out to **The University of Akron. Mail-in applications must be received by January 18, 2010.** (*If you cannot mail it by the 18th, please bring it to the Conference Graduate Credit table at registration, or drop it off at The University of Akron booth in the exhibits.*)

Failure to complete the application properly may delay credit or create headaches for us all!

1. Workshop class number is 14956 and the course number is 7500:590:901.
2. The workshop is titled "2010 OMEA Conference."
3. Credit = 1 semester hour.
4. Cost of the credit is \$450.90 (tuition and fees, **subject to change**).
Out of state students would pay an additional \$260.00. Mailing address establishes Ohio residency.

This credit is offered on a pass/fail basis.

Requirements:

1. Observe at least 12 sessions. The 12 must include at least five concerts and five clinics in your major area of expertise (elementary, middle school, secondary – vocal, general music, instrumental, etc.), **AND** two clinics outside this area of study.
2. Students will be required to compile a log of their attendance throughout the conference.
3. A typed or word-processed annotated synopsis of each session/concert attended must be submitted no later than two weeks after the conference. The synopsis should include critical analysis of the value of the sessions/concert, content, and applications to your particular teaching situation. You may email your paper to the address below (please use WORD format for attachments or copy the paper into the body of the email).
