247 (42.66%) are schoolwide Title I

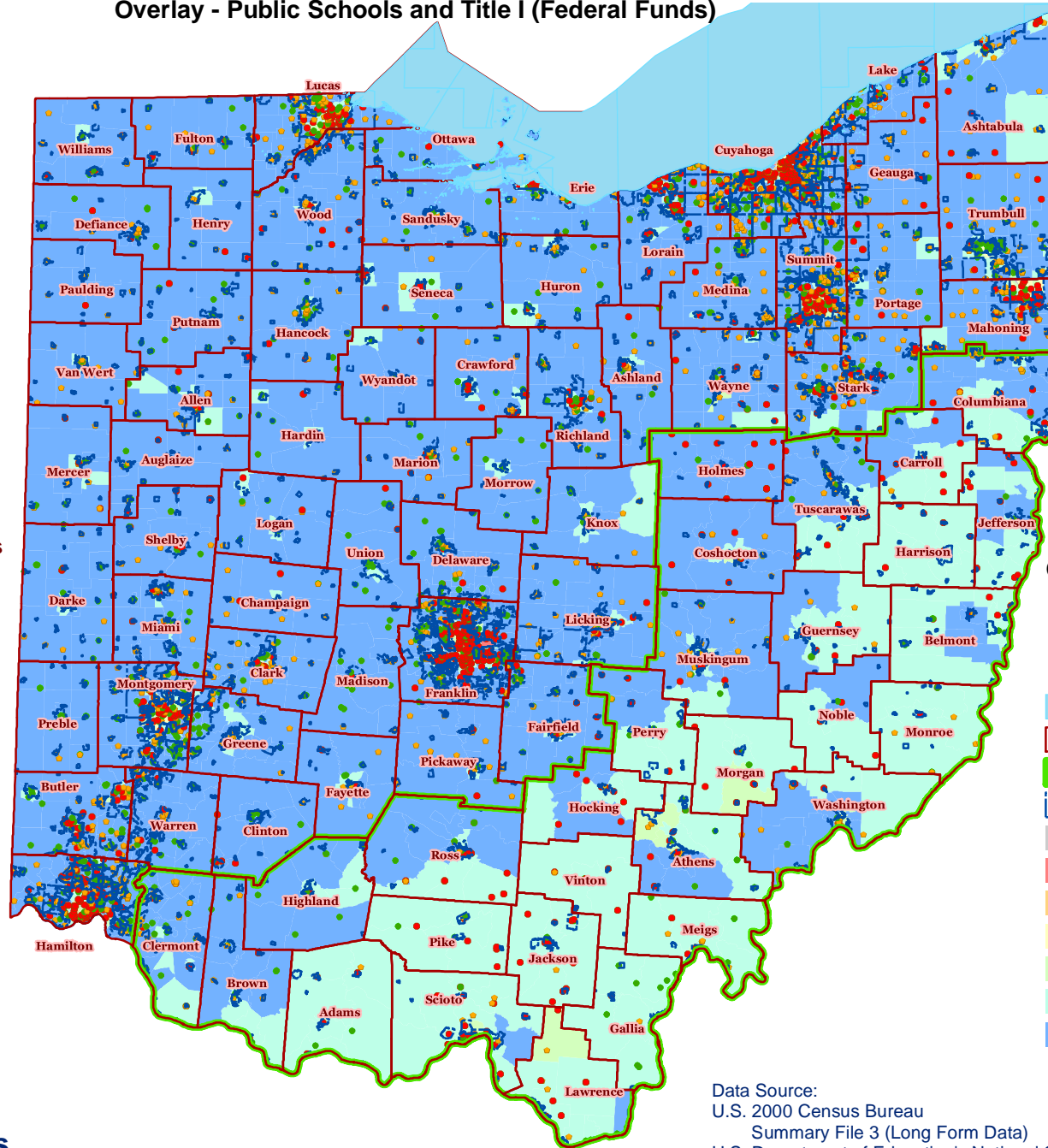
